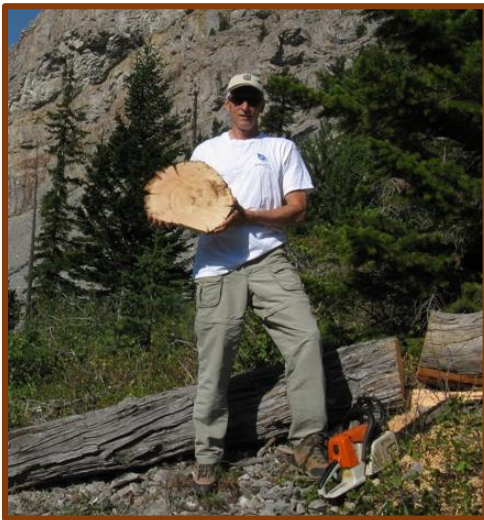

“Climate Change in the Oldman River Basin: A Local Perspective”

Presentation by Dr. Dave Sauchyn (1 hour including time for questions)



Dr. Dave Sauchyn is Research Professor at the Prairie Adaptation Research Collaborative at the University of Regina, Saskatchewan. His main research interests are 1) the climate and hydrology of the past millennium in Canada’s western interior and how knowledge of the past can inform scenarios of future climate and water supplies, and 2) planned adaptation to minimize the adverse impacts of climate change. Dave recently co-directed a five-year interdisciplinary study of the vulnerability of agricultural communities to climate extremes in Chile, Argentina, Colombia and Brazil and the Canadian Prairies, where one of the two study areas was the Oldman River basin.

Dr. Dave Sauchyn poses with a “tree cookie,” that, since its cutting, has provided insight into the climatic variables of the past, and helped climate change scientists forecast the future in terms of climate and available water.
