**Brian Keating** lives about 150 days a year in wilderness locations around the world. He's an adventurer, world traveller, and leader of some 80 expeditions to remote locations in the Arctic and Antarctic, Africa, South America and Canada.

This experience, coupled with his earlier 30-year career of running the Calgary Zoo's Education and Conservation Outreach programs, has given him an unusual perspective into the importance of nature, and what it means to us.

Brian will take us on a visual journey to some of his favourite international locations and adventures including a 200 km trip on horseback in Ethiopia. He will then return to southwestern Alberta, premiering his latest **National Geographic film**, "**Preserving the Last 1%**" which showcases the importance of Alberta's Eastern Slope – the last remaining intact section of the Great North American Plains.

Brian's visual forays reconfirm the value and importance of wild spaces and the creatures that live there. His informative and humorous presentations are designed to inspire, enthuse and make us think.
